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MEETING REPORT FOR THE 2025 BUSINESS ENABLING REFORMS ACTION PLAN (BERAP) STAKEHOLDERS CONSULTATION

Event Details

Event: Stakeholders' Consultation for BERAP 2025

Date: 15th October 2024

Venue: Millennium Hall, Tahir Guest Palace, Kano

Attendance: 37 participants, representing various MDAs and private sector entities

1. Introduction and Objectives

The consultation meeting for the Kano State Business Enabling Reforms Action Plan (BERAP) 2025 aimed to align stakeholders from various sectors towards achieving a business-friendly environment. The meeting provided a platform to discuss challenges, set priorities, and outline actionable plans to support business growth and attract investment to Kano State.

2. Opening Remarks

The session commenced with an address by Abduljabbar Umar, Hon. Commissioner Ministry of Lands and Physical Planning ably represented by the Director Administration and General Services of the Ministry Hamid Sidi Ali. His opening remarks emphasized the government's commitment to reform policies designed to simplify business procedures, improve regulatory efficiency, and foster a favorable environment for investors.

3. Overview of BERAP 2025 Goals

The primary goals for BERAP 2025 include:

- ✓ Enhancing the ease of business registration and licensing processes.
- ✓ Streamlining regulatory compliance across key sectors.
- ✓ Improving access to financial services and investment incentives.
- ✓ Strengthening support for small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs).

Activity Summary

- ✓ Delays in business registration and licensing processes.
- High tax burdens on SMEs.

- ✓ Limited access to loans and grants for local enterprises.
- ✓ Bureaucratic inefficiencies affecting business operations.

Breakout Sessions on Sector-Specific Reforms

Participants were divided into groups to focus on specific sectors such as Agriculture, Finance, Infrastructure, and Legal Frameworks. Each group identified barriers and proposed actionable solutions tailored to their sectors.

Stakeholder Feedback on Proposed Reforms

Insights from breakout groups were shared, emphasizing:

- ✓ The necessity for a unified business registration process.
- ✓ Collaboration between government agencies and private sectors for streamlined operations.
- ✓ Regular training for MDA staff to enhance service delivery.

Development of an Actionable Roadmap

The session concluded with the drafting of a tentative roadmap for BERAP 2025, highlighting timelines, performance metrics, and agency responsibilities.

6. Key Decisions and Next Steps

- a) Immediate reforms will target tax incentives, streamlined licensing, and MDA digitalization.
- Implementation of a grievance redress mechanism to enhance public accountability.
- Quarterly review meetings to monitor progress and address emerging challenges.

The meeting concluded with closing remarks from Hamid Sidi Ali, who commended the collaborative efforts of stakeholders and reiterated the government's dedication to achieving the BERAP 2025 objectives.
